Automated testing with an axe-core-based script, WAVE, and Google Accessibility Scanner with manual verification. We test on the latest versions of Chrome, Edge, Firefox, and Safari

browsers and our mobile apps on various versions of Android (7 and higher), iOS (13 and higher), Windows (10 and 11), and MacOS (13 and higher).
